PHILOSOPHY

DESCRIPTION OF PHILOSOPHY

Philosophy explores why we believe and how we know by engaging us in the deepest, most important and persistent questions concerning the nature of life. By studying philosophy, you are applying critical thinking to the experience of existence and to all dimensions of language in order to understand reality, society, and the self. You should expect to develop outstanding skills in analysis, written and oral communication, critical thinking, and argumentation. With a bachelor's degree in Philosophy, you can pursue entry level positions in government, education, finance, publishing, journalism, business, and research (just to name a few). Likewise, you can continue your education in graduate programs to study business, law, administration, government, religious studies, medicine, or any number of fields in the fine arts and humanities. Because the Philosophy degree can lead you to down many different career paths, it is important to identify an area of interest and take the initiative to develop the appropriate skills, experience, and credentials to enter your chosen field.
